Prestigious MBA now offered at Griffith College Limerick

Griffith College Limerick now offering an MBA - Master of Business Administration, validated by Edinburgh Business School (Heriot - Watt University)

Griffith College Limerick are delighted to announce that the college have been approved by Edinburgh Business School to deliver its prestigious MBA programme at their Limerick campus. The MBA programme can be completed on either a part-time or full-time basis. Both of these options will be available to students in the coming Spring course intake.

The Master of Business Administration programme is a stand-alone qualification offered by Edinburgh Business School (Heriot-Watt University) and will provide participants with a solid theoretical grounding in a range of business disciplines. A long standing attraction of the Master of Business Administration programme is the flexibility of its modular structure, allowing students to progress through a Postgraduate Certificate (3 modules), a Postgraduate Diploma (additional 3 modules) and finally progression to the Master of Business Administration (additional 3 modules).

The 9 modules on the course include: Organisational Behaviour, Economics, Marketing, Accounting, Finance, Project Management, Strategic Planning, Human Resource Management & Competitive Strategy.

All essential learning resources are provided by EBS, both online and in hard copy format. Griffith College Limerick will provide essential student support services including lectures, tutorials, revision workshops and supplementary course materials. Upon completion of the full course students will graduate with a Master's Degree awarded by Heriot Watt University, a globally recognised qualification.

Commencement dates

The Part-time MBA programme will commence on Tuesday 28th February with classes held every Tuesday & Thursday evening, 6.30 – 9.30 and selected revision Saturdays prior to each exam sitting.

The full-time MBA programme will commence on Monday 9th April.
